Frankie Miller is a native of Las Cruces and graduated from Las Cruces High School. She is a graduate student at NMSU in the Public History Program under Jon Hunner and is employed by NMSU as a buyer for the University Bookstore. She has a grown son, Joshua and a 14-year-old daughter Jessica who is active in chamber ballet. While doing an internship with Mary Daniel Taylor's research and personal papers for Rio Grande Historical Collections, she found several letters and personal papers of Father Jean Grange, who had lived in the Taylor home at one time. These papers led to Frankie's thesis research on the contributions of Father Grange and his work as the pastor of San Albino in Mesilla. She has used the Mary and J. Paul Taylor Scholarship to research the Grange years Diocese archives in Tucson, Santa Fe, Las Cruces and El Paso.

Frankie has also been active on the New Mexico Centennial Committee and is the coordinator of a speakers series related to describing events of the last 100 years.


