
January 30th, 2016, Double Eagle Restaurant on the Mesilla Plaza; 12:00 noon

2nd Lt. Charles Gatewood led a company of Apache Scouts at the Battle of Hembrillo, the location of the field trip scheduled for Feb. 13, 2016.

Lt. Gatewood is mentioned in several interviews with Apache leaders conducted by Eve Ball and quoted in her book titled "ENDEH" It seems that Lt. Gatewood was one of only a few US Cavalry Officers that was respected and trusted by Apache leaders with negotiations of various kinds. This is somewhat odd since he had commanded an Apache Scout company and most Apaches considered all Scouts as Traitors.
