A Sad Chapter of the Mexican-American War

On March 17th (St. Patrick's Day) at 1:30pm, a movie, entitled "One Man's Hero", will be shown at the Fountain Theater in Mesilla. The film deals with the unhappy tale of some new immigrants to America who turned against their own comrades in arms during the time when the United States expanded

its territory at its southern border.

The US-Mexican War is a pivotal chapter in the history of North America. It is the war that sealed the fates of its two participants. For the United States, the War garnered huge and important terrain, bootstrapping the fledgling democracy onto the world stage. For the emerging nation of Mexico the loss of their northern borderland sent the country into a tailspin that it is still reckoning with today, roughly one hundred and fifty years later.

Dubious about why they were fighting a Catholic country and fed up with mistreatment by their Anglo-Protestant officers, hundreds of Irish, German and other immigrants deserted Taylor's army and joined forces



with Mexico.

The history of the *San Patricios* is a woeful tale of angry, bewildered, naive, or calculating young men, from varied backgrounds, who deserted for a myriad of reasons and paid a fearful price.
