# Members And Guests Invited To The Awards Banquet Show Your Support For Our Heritage By Attending

The Doña Ana County Historical Society will hold its annual awards luncheon on January 25 at noon in La Posta restaurant in La Mesilla. Members, guests and the public are invited.

The banquet has been held annually for decades to honor individuals who have made a difference in protecting our historical heritage and educating us about it. Also, DACHS identifies properties that are historically significant or that are in danger of disappearing without a fair discussion about their value.

The board of directors has been reviewing potential awards and has already decided on most. However, it is not too late to nominate a person, place or thing. One item already approved for the "Old Timer's Award" is the slot canyon just north of Radium Springs - pictured here. The canyon is an easy family hike in the Cedar Hills west of the Rio Grande.

It might sound like this award should be

for some person with a long association with southern New Mexico. However, the society's award definitions say this award "recognizes a cherished object, natural phenomenon, or cultural tradition prominent in Mesilla Valley heritage." The slot canyon has become a very popular natural phenomenon with dozens of hikers going through it most days.

In addition to the Old Timer's Award there will be awards for authors and buildings in the Las Cruces area.

The cost of the Mexican buffet luncheon is \$25. **RESERVATIONS ARE REQUIRED** for the event. Last year we ended up with many people showing up to eat and not paying their way. This year we'd like you to prepay by making your reservation and paying from the DACHS website.

TANT PART - there will be a "write a note" window for you to enter the names of the people attending. We need that information to create a list for check-in and to make name tags.

### **DACHS Elections Were Held Nov. 21 And Bylaws OKed**

The November 21 presentation at the Good Samaritan auditorium was preceded with a couple of historical society business matters.

First of all, the DACHS bylaws had been updated by the board of directors. Those changes were put to a vote of the membership as required by the bylaws and they passed without dissent.

Second, President Dennis Daily announced the candidates for at-large board members and officers. All were approved in a single vote after a member moved that the group be voted on as a single block. There was no dissent.

The new at-large members of the board are: Leah Tookey Christopher Schurtz Nathan Japel

The officer positions were simply re-elected: Jerry Wallace as vice president Garland Courts as treasurer

There were no candidates for the vacant secretary's position which means a volunteer is still needed. If a candidate comes forward, the president can appoint that person to the job until the next election cycle at the end of 2025.

### NMSU Display Of Ballard Photos Still At Old Branigan

The exhibit "The Ballard Photo Studio: A Portrait of Community," featuring more than 200 portraits and other photographic works by Las Cruces photographer Jim Ballard, is still up at the Branigan Cultural Center. These works offer a snapshot of the Mesilla Valley community between 1930 and 1950. The images are from the Ballard Photo Studio collection at the NMSU Library Archives. The exhibit runs through Saturday, February 15, 2025.

Jim Ballard operated his photo studio on Main Street, where he created portraits of more than 5,000 Mesilla Valley residents.

These two photos are from the exhibit and feature two military men. On the left is Lt. Col. Harold Turner, the first commander of what was then White Sands Proving Ground. Turner was commander from 1945 to 1947.

Ballard's 5x7 negatives offer great detail. On



Turner's coat lapels is the Odnance Corps insignia. White Sands was an Odnance Corps facility for a long time. On his left breast, above the rows of ribbons, is an aviation badge. It is difficult to see all of the detail but it looks like an observer's badge. It means he wasn't a pilot but once had the job of being an observer on Army Air Force aircraft.

The young man on the right is Eugene A. Baird in a different Army uniform that was worn by ROTC students at NMSU. On Baird's lapels, instead of the Ordnance Corps ball and flame, he is wearing the crossed rifles of the Infantry Branch. Above that insignia is "ROTC." On his shoulder there is the backwards swastika of NMSU and two diamonds designating his cadet rank of lieutenant colonel. Such a rank was given to seniors who were outstanding cadets. When he graduated from NMSU, he would have had the rank of a second lieutenant.



### Farm And Ranch Museum To Host "Farm La-La" On Dec. 17

The New Mexico Farm & Ranch Heritage Museum's third-annual Farm La-La, featuring Christmas lights, trolley rides, s'mores, hot chocolate, and craft activities is going to be December 17 from 5 to 8 p.m. - just in time to get you, the kids and the grandchildren in the mood for Christmas. Admission is only \$5 *per family* and includes access to all of the museum's exhibits.

The event is hosted by the Farm & Ranch Heritage Museum and the Friends of the Museum.

The museum is located at 4100 Dripping Springs Road in Las Cruces.

This is a family-oriented Holiday celebration. Kids will have chances to decorate cookies and holiday ornaments, hear stories, make s'mores over a campfire, and take trolley rides around the livestock areas of the Museum grounds. Santa and the Grinch may make appearances, especially in the evening.


